Malaysia Day Celebrations



We had lots going on to celebrate Malaysia Day on Thursday. The whole school dressed in Malaysian national dress or Malaysian flag colours. Years 1, 2 and 3 shared some of their learning about Malaysian history, language and culture at our Spotlight Assembly. Y6 learners shared their MHL Malaysia Day projects with Y1 and Y2.

This week in Upper Phase in Science we have enjoyed practical investigations about Forces. In Year 5 we started by exploring how friction can affect the speed and distance an object travels, while Year 6 created brilliant Knowledge Harvest posters. We have then looked at how Archimedes discovered displacement while in the bathtub, by testing the buoyancy of items and then using our learning to make and test foil boats.



After this we looked at Leonardo Da Vinci's work on air resistance and how his designs led to the development of air travel 500 years later. We then made and tested paper helicopters. What will we learn about next?

Last week, Year 1 and 2 enjoyed their first session up in our jungle. They enjoyed hunting for insects, studying fungus and mixing magic potions. Our friends from Myanmar also enjoyed the session. They found the rope bridge and marvelled at our beautiful rainforest. We look forward to more learning next week.
