Message from The Principal



I met with John, one of the current leaders of the Chin Student Organization earlier this week. This is the group from Myanmar that brings a number of displaced children to our school on Thursday afternoons. I wanted to know whether the programme was worth fighting for and what the children got from their visits.

As a child, John found himself in KL after fleeing Myanmarr and spoke of how he was helped and influenced enormously by the time he spent at Nexus International School. Yes, John came to our school as a child and through our *Myanmarr Learner Programme* was able to spend time integrating with Nexus learners and learning from and with them. He is now helping others in the community to get a better start in life.

This filled me with an enormous sense of pride and confidence that not only does our Myanmar programme help our own learners to Celebrate Diversity and learn about other cultures butcalso makes a palpable difference to the lives of children less fortunate.

The plan is that there will be 27 learners who join some of our classes in Year 5, 6 and 7 on Tuesday afternoons. They will eat together with our children and join a CCA programme (run by Nexus learners, under the guidance of Ms Anna and Mr Brian).

Chin Student Organization (CSO) was formed in 12th March 2005, when university students from Myanmar found Chin children wandering the streets of Kuala Lumpur. When no one else would help, the students took it upon themselves to teach the kids.

At present, we have been running the organization being put on the shoulder of 20 volunteers teaching around 300 students at 2 learning centres towards educational goals.

Our Friday night quiz time with Mr Chris sees teams competing against each other for prizes and pride...how would you do against these teams?








