As a new learner at Nexus it was a really good experience to meet new friends and find out more about each other as well as learning about new things together.



# Spotlight on Learning Year 6 Mapping Skills

This week we have been talking to some hardworking Year 6 learners who have been incredibly busy using their mapping skills to locate rivers around the world.



It was clear to see that concentration, the ability to use a key and to be able to plot rivers on their own maps were all skills essential for this learning. Some geographical knowledge such as knowing what a continent is and how to find the contenant you want in an Atlas was also necessary. The learners also showed a good understanding of their expectations selecting the resource most suited for the task (in this case Atlas's worked better than Google Earth).

This was new learning and so the learners had to use their resilience. "I'm resilient because I don't quit when rivers are hard to find!" Shinthy (5E)

When asked what they had enjoyed or found interesting about todays task the learners all said they had enjoyed it. "I liked the challenge and the opportunity to explore new places and find rivers I didn't know existed. Next I would like to use the internet to do more research about some of the rivers that I found." Sabrina (5E)

Learners were asked how they would use this learning in the real world. They were eager to share their plans to use these skills when traveling and visiting new places. It was clear that the learners appreciated the relevance of this learning and so they were motivated and successful in achieving their goals.

Well done Year 6, fantastic mapping skills. You are awesome!

# The Start of Our 'Second Year' of the IB Diploma Programme

The success of our IB Programme continues to generate interest both in Malaysia and abroad. There were many applications to join the new Year 12 cohort and so far we have enrolled 43 learners with another 5 learners joining us in the next few weeks – we have already met our Year 12 capacity. This represents a tremendous growth from our first group of 24 learners last year and is a tribute to all the hard work learners, teachers and admin have put in to making the IB at Nexus a quality product. We have introduced new courses in Sports, Exercise and Health Science and Film Studies and I am excited about the opportunities these will afford those studying them.

We are not resting on our laurels however and I am pleased to report that Mrs Abena has been appointed as IB Learning Advisor. We were fortunate to be selected by the IB organization to participate in a pilot project involving other international schools under the title Approaches to Teaching and Learning, which will look at how to implement the latest research on effective educational practice. This will help ensure that Nexus International School remains at the cutting edge of all that is new and exciting in the field of international education.

After a two day induction programme, which amongst other things involved dragon boat racing on Putrajaya Lake the year 12s have settled into their programme of study. A number switched subjects in the first few weeks and of course we will be monitoring their progress over the coming weeks and months to make sure they have adopted the most appropriate package. In order to assist learners, parents can access Managebac where all assignments they have to complete should be recorded. Every parent should have received log in details for Managebac but please let me know if this is not the case. We are also developing a Nexus IB site for parents: I will tell you a bit more about this in future as it is developed.

A word now about our Year 13s, who have emerged battered and bruised but still smiling after the first year of IB. This term will be one of the busiest for them as so many coursework deadlines start looming and they also have preparation for college applications. (Mr Joel Connor has been appointed as Higher Education Counsellor).

Please treat them gently with lots of encouragement as they may be starting to feel the pressure and remind them that our counselor Malou Bromley is always available to speak to if they are feeling a bit overwhelmed.

When asked if the IB is an easy programme to complete I always reply no, but usually follow this up with the comment that nothing worthwhile in life is ever easy to achieve. Our learners can have the confidence that they are studying on the premier educational course for learners aged 16-18 in international schools today and that their qualification will open many doors for them in the future.

## Good readers are good learners Helping young readers at home

Reading out loud to someone every day is essential for beginning readers. Although fluency and accuracy are signs of a good reader, understanding what they have read is key. There are many ways that parents can help young readers. Here are just a few tips:

 Use a ruler or card under the sentence to help the reader track and focus on the words they are reading.

#### For fluency:

- Read aloud to your child, then get them to match their voice to yours and
- Reading their favourite books and poems over and over again will help their reading become smoother. Encourage reading with expression.

#### For understanding:

- Always discuss the **meaning of words** that are new to the reader.
- Ask questions... what happened? Why do you think she did that? etc
