After almost two years of reviewing and refining the way we use the IPC at Nexus to improve children's learning we were recently accredited as a Mastering school.

This is no small feat and we are currently the only school in Malaysia to achieve this level of accreditation. We now join a select number of schools around the world that have this status.

We are absolutely thrilled to have earned the accolade and congratulations go to the whole Nexus community, including many parents, who contributed.

#### Below are 9 criterions:

- 1. A clear focus on children's learning.
- 2. Shared outcomes about the kinds of children we are helping to develop.
- 3. Implementation of classroom practices that help children develop as we would like.
- 4. International Mindedness.
- 5. An appropriate balance between knowledge, skills and reflection leading to understanding.
- 6. Appropriately rigorous children's learning and teachers' high expectations of it.
- 7. Implementation of the brain-friendly elements of the IPC.
- 8. Implementation of themes through integrated yet separate subjects.
- 9. Assessment and evaluation that supports and informs learning rather than dictates it.

### CAS Reflections: "Ann Yap"

Recently, I've participated two overseas Perth fencing competitions: Singapore. I've met new friends, learnt new tactics and most importantly experienced something I wouldn't normally get in Malaysia. My team and I received a Silver Medal for team events in Perth. It was an experience I can never forget because it was my first time fencing against the Australians. Singapore was definitely challenging because the fencers there are well prepared and strong. While fencing, I realised the amount of skills, stamina and strength that was needed to compete with them and I realised my current progress was insufficient to compete with them.

Despite my terrible performance in Singapore, it has definitely motivated me to train harder. Never giving up is an important thing in Fencing. I realised that no matter how far the point differences is, if I don't give up, nothing is impossible. My coach told me to work on my lunges and posture because these two are the key positions in fencing. If any of these went wrong, I will be unstable and fall. Working on my posture and lunges will be my focus for the next few weeks.

Overall, I really enjoyed fencing fencers in different countries because it provided me with new ideas and tactics to use.





#### **Reflection Of Taiwanese Exchange Programme**

Our school has been privileged to have the opportunity to welcome Taiwanese learners and teachers to Nexus on an exchange programme.

On the 4th of December, 24 learners and 4 teachers from the Taiwan Chudong Junior High School visited our school. On the first day, the Nexus learners and the Taiwanese learners engaged in an ICT project, where the learners either interviewed the teachers in Nexus or made an introductory video to a lesson in Nexus. As the learners were able to use both English and Mandarin to conduct and record the videos, they were able to apply their knowledge of the language to a real life situation. An interview with Ms Alison, Mr Steven, Mr Martyn and Ms Wong was filmed by the Nexus TV Production team. This was an interview regarding the exchange programme.

On the second day, the Taiwanese and Nexus learners were involved in a treasure hunt organised by the Year 12 IB Mandarin learners. The learners had fun in this activity as they were able to work in teams with their new friends to solve various guizzes. (Lee Jia-An, 13N)

Last week, the Taiwanese learners from Chudong School came to Nexus International School Putrajaya for a student exchange programme.
