This week we are talking to Hung and Faig from 4E

What is your current IPC topic?

It is Homes and Habitats. We will be finding out about how houses have

changed in history and how they are built to suit different environments.

What are you learning?

We are learning how to weave with our hands. We have learned that many items are made out of weaving like furniture, baskets and clothes. Natural materials are used to weave like rattan. Natural materials are used because they are cheap and easy to find because they are almost everywhere.

Why are you learning this today?

It is a new skill that is fun to practice. It is linked to our topic on shelters because some shelters are made using the weaving technique.

Which of our personal goals are you focusing on?

We showed resilience because we didn't give up. It was very hard at first and we kept making mistakes. I also showed respect to my friends as I gathered materials for everyone to use, not just myself.

What are the next steps in your learning?

Our next steps will be to learn about other artistic techniques. We are going to find out how to use wax resist to represent habitats.






Year 2 Entry Point (From A to B)

This week for Year 2 has been a very busy one. It's only the start of term – and we have 'hit the ground running'.

After last week the learners took part in a Knowledge Harvest for our new IPC theme 'From A to B' and they reflected on what they already know about transport and travel, as well as considering the things they would like to find out throughout this theme.

This information will be used by Mr James and Ms Clare to plan for the coming weeks in Year 2!

The educreations Ipad app helped the learners to find things online that supported them in showing their current understanding of the theme. They used this to search for images, add voice and text to these images to explain their current understanding.

IGCSE Results 2014

Congratulations to all our learners for their outstanding effort in the IGCSE examinations.

In total 698 IGCSE exams were taken and the percentage of students who scored A*- C was 70%, this is comparable to the UK GCSE A*- C percentage of 69%. The percentage of students who scored A*-A was 30%, 8 learners attained 7 A*/A's or more.

Ryan Lee Boon Wai and Ling Xue Jing attained excellent results with 10 A's in total (5 A*, 5 A's).

The overall pass rate for A* to G was 99.7%. In this cohort, the students performed as expected with the value added percentage slightly improving from last year.
