This week we are talking to learners in Year 1.

Kayla, what is your IPC theme this half-term? "We are learning about our world"

What are you learning about Our World Kayla? "We are learning about plants and other things. We went to the Wetlands this week. We saw lots of different plants and we saw animals like Pink Flamingos and Ducks"

"We have been learning a lot of science. We have plants in coloured water and we're trying to see if the plants change colour. We also planted beans, we put some of the plants in the light and some in the dark to see if they both grow the same. We also have grapes and we want to see if we leave them to dry will they turn in to raisins"

"We are learning about the things that plants might need to grow and have planted different seeds"

"One of my seeds didn't start to grow – I think it's because I put too much water in it."

From Tree to Treat

The Year 4 learners had a very unusual learning experience this week during their IPC topic 'Chocolate'. Over three lessons the learners got the chance to experience the working conditions of people at different stages of the process of turning cacao beans into chocolate (from Tree to Treat): the cacao farmer; the chocolate factory worker and the advertising executive. The forth lesson of the week was spent reflecting on their feelings during the activities. This was to enable them greater empathy for the people, such as cacao farmers, in preparation for the introduction of the concept of Fair Trade.

The children showed how resilient they could be and used their flexible thinking skills when they put themselves in other people's shoes.

Here are some quotes from the learners:

Cacao Farmer Experience

Xuen "We had to pretend we were cacao farmers. First, we had to get cacao seeds from the trees using a long stick. Next we had to crack the seeds using a bat. Finally we had to separate the beans. I felt very tired because we had to work so hard. Nothing was easy. I think that the cacao farmers would be more tired than us because they have to do this all day every day. Now I know what it feels like to be a cacao farmer."

Factory Worker Experience

Zen "In the factory we had to make chocolate packages and sort colours and numbers. I felt frustrated being bossed around by the boss. I was worried that I would lose my job or be demoted because I was not working as fast as some of the other people in the group. It became boring after a while. I think real life factory workers would feel tired and bored."

Advertising Executive Experience

Samara" We had to create an advert for Milky Way chocolate so that sales would rise. We had to taste the chocolate, brainstorm adjectives and then create a campaign. I enjoyed it because it was fun tasting the chocolate and using our imaginations to make the advert. Many people came up with fun ideas. I imagine that being an advertising executive would be fun and tiring."

Parent - Teacher Communication - Making That Link Between Home And School.



As a learner, I remember dreading my parents coming in to school. The only time they came into school (with the exception of school productions) was when I was in trouble.

As a teacher now, I know that it is important to build positive relationships between parents and teachers to fully cultivate the teaching and learning process. Establishing that link between home and school gives the learners consistency and security in their learning.

A learner who has a clear understanding of the expectation of his teachers and parents and

knows that there is regular communication between them is likely to make more effort.

Teachers and parents will agree that a good relationship between them is invaluable. The cooperative trust that is built between the two ensures a common goal that is more easily achieved.

As a parent, you may have questions and concerns about the learning, homework or curriculum. We are always learning and the developments in education may sometimes be a source of contention. It is important that you check with your child's teacher to clear any misunderstanding or misconceptions.

Last and certainly not least, get involved in what your child's learning. I've learnt a great deal through mine! For some, homework time may not be the best way to bond though and if it's interfering with your relationship, it's not worth the pain.
