
Year 13 **Art Exhibition**

Book Week's Over But The Reading Must Go On!

Children who read for pleasure do significantly better at school (IOE 2013).

Reading builds vocabulary, boosts writing skills, improves general knowledge and fosters creativity. It develops memory, concentration, an empathy for others, and an understanding of the world. Reading is a great habit and if you can encourage a love of reading in your child you'll build a skill for life.

- Whilst some children fall in love with reading easily, others take more persuading and teenage boys in particular sometimes lose the reading habit. Here are some ideas about how to keep your children reading.
- Let them see you enjoying reading. It doesn't matter if you're reading in English or in another language.
- Make reading a part of daily life. Leave all sorts of reading materials (books, magazines, newspapers and catalogue) around your house.
- Read aloud to your children. When they
 finally decide they are too old for a bedtime
 story (which will probably be a long time
 after they can read themselves) encourage
 them to read aloud to their siblings.
- Let children choose their own books.
 Almost anything your youngsters read—including comics—helps build reading skills.

If your child is an EAL learner don't worry if they prefer to read in their mother tongue. Similarly, if you're not confident reading in English, then share stories and read aloud in your home language. The skills built in one language transfer to the second language.

(Krashen,2004). It's the process of reading together, sharing books and building a reading habit which is important and one of the greatest gifts a parent can give a child.

喜爱阅读的孩子, 在求学过程中佔着极大的优势。

阅读不但可以建立孩子对辞彙的认识,还可以增强写作能力,拓展常识与薀育创意思考能力。透过阅读,孩子们可以集中精神,并透过对书中角色的暸解培养怜悯心。基本上,鼓励孩子阅读绝对是一项有利无弊的抉择。

即使有些孩子懂得自动自发地接触书籍,仍然有些孩子需要父母三催四请才肯阅读。 这种情况经常发生在正值青春期的男孩身上。以下提供的是鼓励孩子保持阅读习惯的小技巧:

- · 让他们看见您沉浸于书籍, 笃志好学的模样。书籍的选择并不局限于英文, 任何语言都可以激励孩子们效彷。
- · 在家中的个个角落摆放读物(报章、杂志、小说……任何格式皆可),使阅读彻底融入孩子们的日常生活。
- · 为孩子们朗读故事,当他们长大,有能力自行阅读时,也可以鼓励他们为弟弟妹妹说睡前故事。
- · 给孩子们自行选择读物的空间以有效建立 阅读能力。

假如英文并非你孩子的第一语言,您也可以鼓励他们阅读母语的书籍。 相对的,如果您的英语阅读能力并不突出,您也可以以母语向孩子们分享故事并朗读睡前故事。一起阅读的过程中所得到的喜悦绝对是父母亲们可以给孩子的一份大礼。
