

# **Year 7 Shape to Form Still Life**

#### Painting techniques using grayscale

Year 7 learners are currently finishing their Shape and Form topics and have produced some interesting final responses. They were introduced to grayscale, and using their painting tools to create some interesting textures with their artwork.

A gray scale or value scale is a sequence of tones from light to dark that can be made between black and white (as the darkest and lightest tones respectively). A gray scale is a useful tool for learners to accurately judge the tone or value of the subject they're painting.

They later experimented using primary and secondary colours to create some creative monochromatic tones before planning their final responses for this topics.








# **Celebrating Effort**

#### What can 'effort' do for you?



As teachers, we are often amazed by what our learners can produce. Ocasionally, we wish that they had made 'just that little bit more effort'. But, what do we mean by this elusive term, "effort"?

"Effort" can mean trying again. It can mean trying really hard the first time. It can mean doing something new. Depending on who you ask, "effort" adapts.

Recently, I set my Year 9 class the task of writing a comparative essay considering the use of plot type in two short stories - by any measure, an appropriately challenging task to push these learners into their ZPD (Zone of Proximal Development).

Whilst marking my Year 9 books this week, I was introduced to a whole new level of "effort". Aissa (from 9N) turned in a piece of work that sung "effort". The quiet pride in her face as I discussed her work with her revealed the enigmatic personal results of her effort. However, it was also the utterly beaming pride of Miss Seela - Aissa's PLA, that helped add another layer to my understanding of "effort". The support and collaboration had clearly paid off. The perseverance of Miss Seela and the willingness of Aissa (who will freely admit that writing isn't her 'favourite thing') revealed what can happen if we just make the "effort".

Aissa managed to produce four and a bit full A4 pages – the most she has ever written! Ever.

Unable to ignore this supreme display of effort, I now have to ask myself the following questions:

"Is 'effort' one of the answers when we get stuck?"

"What can 'effort' do for me?"

"Is this the same level of 'effort' that Aissa and Miss Seela showed?"


# **Creative Writing in Yr 9**

The paragraph below is a good example of creative writing that can be produced by hand in a short period of time.




