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Arena of Youth 2050 - Real Issues, Real City, Real Malaysia, Real Competition

Nexus are proud to have been selected to take part in the 'Arena of Youth' to design a future ready city for 2050. A Youth parliament competition demanding a team of 10 Nexus learners tackle real issues with sustainable solutions. With 10 schools confirmed and potentially another 20 from across Malaysia the competition is on!

The event is hosted by the Construction Industry Development Berhad Malaysia, running from January to mid April 2016 ending in a week of finals. Below is an extract from the CIDB 'Arena of Youth' handbook 2016.

"We like to believe that the youth of Malaysia represent the future of this country. The Arena of Youth (AoY) was developed as a platform for the youth of Malaysia to express their ideas. This competition will task the students with developing creative solutions to real-world problems, testing their knowledge and skills of construction and related disciplines to the fullest. Year 8 Art Learners Design Scenes for Grease

Grease is the word!

This term, Year 8 are busy designing scenes for the school production of Grease, which will be performed on January the 20th and 21st 2016. The Visual Arts Department has injected a 'real life', work experience assignment into the curriculum, which allows the Year 8 learners to experience scenic design and production.

First the learners measured the school theatre for the purpose of building a scaled down model box in which to put their designs. Once they had researched the era of the 1950's, the learners worked in groups to design scaled scenes to fit into the theatre model box. They then photographed their work, see pictures below.

The next 'stage' in the project will be to paint the various backdrops onto scene flats, and onto 3 Periaktos. The learners have learnt that using the ancient Greek invension of 'Periaktoi' (a device used for displaying and rapidly changing theatre scenes), more different scenes can be painted and rotated on caster wheels.

Unfortunately, not all of the designs can be used. Some will be, whilst other designs are amalgamated into final designs, but the whole flavour of the design has a definate 'Year 8' feel to it!

Over the next few weeks the scenery will be painted by Year 8. They will have help from the props and scenerey CCA club, yet all of Nexus is welcome to add their touch, and this can be done on Wednesdays from 3:15pm to 4:30pm. Please feel free to join in.

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
Every Friday afternoon, I will be learning how to play the Guitar. This activity will be a new challenge for me as I have never learnt how to play one before. Thankfully i have found two learners who are willing to help me set the stepping stones for my journey of learning how to play the guitar. Keeping in mind this lesson only teaches at a rudimentary level.

In the first day i was taught three notes, which were A minor, C and E. I was given the most basic notes to start off as it would make more sense to learn. The biggest challenge when it comes to learning how to play the guitar for me is it takes a while to familiarise myself with the strings as well as the frets. It is certainly a new feeling and experience when it comes to holding the guitar in the first place. One of the crucial things i learnt when playing it is the user's hand must not be stiff, but smooth to reflect the music coming from the instrument.

It took quite a while to get used to placing my left hand on the frets, and moving along it. It certainly requires a ridiculous amount of skill and time when it comes to playing the guitar. Another challenging aspect for me is memorising the finger placements on the frets, as it felt very awkward to a beginner. One thing to notice about guitar is that it requires a lot of non-dominant hand movement, which requires a great amount of muscle memory.

This activity taught me how hard it is when it comes to playing the guitar, it also shows me how playing a guitar is even possible to begin with. Kudos to those who have mastered the spectacular instrument, i will continue on with my journey to learning the basics of a guitar, as it is only the beginning.




Year10 Digital Literacy Photoshop project Propaganda posters

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
Siti Nurhadzlin Sahari - Ice Skating Success








24hr Run To Stop The Traffik

Last weekend, students from international schools across Malaysia had committed themselves to run for a total of 24 Hours in a marathon that aimed to end slavery. Three teams from Nexus International School had done exactly this. Pushing themselves to the limit; hurting so the victims of slavery no longer had to. From the boiling midday sun to the cool, airy night, we were the runners for the freedom of others.

There's nothing more I can stress than the willpower that it took to jog up that hill with its measly ten percent incline for the twentieth time, pushing to hand the baton over to the next runner, rinse and repeat. The amount of effort it took to run just a little faster so I could get out of the scorching heat that was slowly cooking my brain. All these basic problems, short term compared to the impact that we were making on the lives of those who have had their future stolen from them.

The cause that we were running for was a huge motivation for me. Knowing that every lap I ran would free an individual caught in the web of the dark side of humanity. A sex slave. A child forced into labour. Knowing that for every lap completed, it would be giving them what they should have had. For every kilometer covered, would be allowing them to ease back into society.

Sure, there was the bigger picture of things that kept many people going but what really kept our team afloat, was each other. A good leader and reliable friends who were in pain with you or supportive all the way. Nothing felt better than seeing everybody proud of each other, exceeding each other's expectations. It wasn't even about winning. It was about perseverance, resilience and the will to run for those who can't.







Admin: maintaining our database and managing the accounts.


Help at meetings: a small group of parents who who be happy to help at meeting on a rota basis.
