On Sunday 24th January 2016 was the first big karting race for year 2016 in Malaysia. I haven't raced for almost four months since my last race in September 2015 and I was very excited to participate in the Junior category which is for drivers age 13 – 16 years old. Drivers from many parts of Asia and few drivers from Europe came to Sepang International Karting Circuit to race in the Rotax Invitational Race 2016. The event was divided into several races. The official Practice day was on Friday 22nd January and the Qualifying, Heat 1 and Heat 2 was on Saturday 23rd January. On Sunday was when all the most exciting races happened in Pre-Finals and Finals.

On Saturday, the races went well for me when I qualified 3rd out of 24 drivers with only missing out by a tenth for pole position. Heat 1 went smoothly as I moved up to 2nd position immediately after the start of the race and controlled it all through the race but unfortunately dropped to 3rd position on the 20th lap which was the last lap. I finished 4th in Heat 2 which means I could start 3rd position in Pre-Finals. During Pre-Finals on Sunday, I suffered engine problems which caused me to finish 5th position. I started 5th in the Finals and everything was going as planned as I climbed up to 2nd spot until my progress was hindered badly with an unlucky turn one incident which damaged my kart and costing a lot of precious time. I fought hard to catch up and recovered from the back of the field and caught up to 10th place before being involved in a second race incident and ended up finishing in 13th place for Finals. The top 3 finishers for Finals were from Singapore, Indonesia and China respectively.

Overall it was a fun and good weekend as this was the first time I raced with a new management team and used a different kart chassis. I usually race with my older brother Armand Johany 11N but he has to take a break from racing to focus on his studies for IGCSE. I am looking forward to more races this year. I also realised that even though I am not working with the younger Myanmar learners, they still tend to follow the way I behave and the way I speak therefore I should always remember to not behave badly and to mind the language that I use.
