The best ideas have been invited to present to Ms Alison and Mr Chris, so that they might get funding from the school to put their ideas into action. Watch this space!

Overall, it was very enjoyable and I would love to do another project similar to this.

Kaylie:

Making two small partnering sculptures instead of one large sculpture of a singular character was challenging because polystyrene gets harder to work with, as the work gets smaller in scale. Since the piece consisted of two sculptures which had to fit together, the bigger character had to be made first.

What proved remarkable was the class and skill with which the delegation conducted itself, both in and out of debate. Danial Shariat from Y13 and Riana Adams from Y12 took the breath of the audience away by performing on stage during the gala dinner. No one cheered louder than the seemingly imperceptible Nexus table of 3 at the back of the hall. In debate, at the end of three days, Nexus made a sweep of 4 awards in one of Malaysia's most prestigious conferences. While nowhere close to its best outings in terms of awards won, it was still impressive considering the minute size of the delegation.


